Finding your way to Sandy Park, Exeter

Sandy Park, Exeter is located at The Exeter Chiefs Rugby ground, conveniently located just off Junction 30 of the M5

The venue is 10 minutes away from Exeter Airport, on a main cycle route, served by both Digby and Sowton and Newcourt railway stations and within easy reach of Exeter City Centre.

There is an onsite car park at Sandy Park with over 500 spaces. Please note the venue works with Premier Park who operate an Automatic Plate Recognition (ANPR) system whereby all vehicle registrations will be captured on arrival and departure by camera.

- All visitors will need to enter their vehicle registration number at one of the machines in the car park
- There is no need to display the receipt in the vehicle once paid
- Visitors can top up at a machine or by RingGo if overstayed
- Parking is charged at £5 for up to 12 hours

Sandy Park has two rail stations in close proximity, both on the Avocel Line between Exeter and Exmouth. Travellers to and from Exeter are advised to aligt at Digby & Sowton, whereas those travelling to or from Exmouth should use Newcourt. Both stations are clearly signposted from Sandy Park and are approximately a 15 minute walk away.

Alternatively Exeter's two main rail stations, Exeter St David's and Exeter Central are located approximately 5 miles from Sandy Park.

Taxi's are available at both stations with an approximate journey time of 15 minutes.
